Directions: The climax of the story is the point of greatest interest or suspense in the story. It is the turning point in the story where the action reaches its peak. The climax is usually the most exciting part of the story and something worth barking about!

Directions: The conclusion of the story is when the main character solves the problem. The story usually ends happily and it is a tail wagging event!
